The meeting was called to order by Secretary Hicks-Thomas. Commission members as well as staff were introduced. At 10:21 a.m. it was moved that the meeting go into closed session to discuss the artists' work and review the artists' models pursuant to § 2.2-3711 A(3) and (6) and § 2.2-3712.

Upon completing discussion of the artists and their work, and after passing the motion to go back into open session, the Committee did so with each member making the certification pursuant to § 2.2-3712.

The Commission members unanimously selected StudioEIS and 1717 Design Group as the design team to build the Monument (Senators McDougle and Vogel by letter). Susan Schaar volunteered to call and check the winning artists' references. The next step in the process would be to notify all of the artists. The Commission decided to announce the winning submission at the Library of Virginia's event to honor Virginia's Women of History in honor of Women's History Month, and Paul Nardo volunteered to draft the press release.

As planned, Sandra Treadway and Alice Lynch would continue to head up the historical and fundraising aspects of the project. The artists that were not selected would be given the option to pick up their models or have them sent to the archives at the Library of Virginia. The commission adjourned after much concentrated and driven discussion, satisfied completely with their design selection.
